- A. Commissioner Lee Welcome to Nkauj lab and looking forward to expanded capacity. Challenging year and figuring our role to supporting our community.

### VI. Executive Director Report

#### A. Budget / Operations

- 1. Excited to be here and one-on-one's with Commissioners have been very fruitful.
- 2. \$13,500 cut from the State making current budget \$486,500
  - a) Next year's budget will also be cut by \$14,000 bringing budget to \$486,000
  - Question from Chair Ramakrishnan about whether unspent funds from this year will carry over into next year; current understanding was yes, it would carry over
- 3. Executive Director Yang reviewed the current expense budget and proposed changes as outlined in the Executive Director report
  - a) GovOps estimates \$100K in start-up costs such as Bagley Keene training, procurement services, etc
  - b) Discussion was held on the proposed second staff meeting, whether admin or program, and also whether the budgeted item is sufficient to cover benefits; perhaps there needs to be give in the proposed office expenses
  - Executive Director Yang is exploring the possibility of purchasing power so that every acquisition does not need to go through the state
- 4. Operations work is intense and includes Department of General Services, Department of Technology, Department of Finance, CalHR
  - a) Workers Compensation Policy will need to be purchased and will not be included even though we are part of the State;
    Commissioner Lee will work with the Executive Director on this issue
- 5. Sexual Harassment and Ethics trainings need to be completed before end of January and certificate of attendance given to Executive Director

#### **B.** Policy and Program Priorities

- Overall priorities are Relationship Building, Programs, Policy Priorities (bills and implementation), Internal Infrastructure, and Communications Strategies
- 2. The Executive Director's written report provided more detail about Policy Priorities on the following areas: Health access (AB 1726 data disaggregation law), Education equity, and Immigrant and Refugee Rights
  - a) Campaign for College Opportunity, EPIC, Advancing Justice, and other community organizations may be a good resource on data disaggregation advocacy



- b) Establishing a California AANAPISI program
- c) In general, the Commission should establish a process for endorsement of bills, etc., perhaps through a committee
- d) Budget advocacy is also another possible venue for involvement
- e) Economic security could be another proposed category for policy advocacy
- f) Commission should coordinate with APILC
- g) Action item to make the website a place where members of the community can give us feedback about what the Commission should be working on, using google forms, etc
- 3. The Executive Director's written report provided more detail about Program Priorities on the following areas: API organization survey, Public Hearings, Internship/Volunteer Program, Partnerships
  - a) February hearing on the Road to COVID Recovery
- 4. The Executive Director's written report provided more detail about Communications Priorities on the following areas: Set up Infrastructure, Narrative Shift, and Monthly/Quarterly Newsletter
